**Jack Dunford, MBE**, is the Executive Director of the Thai Burma Border Consortium (TBBC) and the Chairperson of the Committee for Coordination of Services to Displaced Persons in Thailand (CCSDPT). TBBC is a consortium of 11 NGOs from 9 countries providing food, shelter, non-food items and capacity building support to around 140,000 refugees in 9 camps along the Thai Burma border, receiving funding from 15 governments, including AusAID. Mr Dunford's visit to Australia will focus on conflict in eastern Burma and the resulting issues for refugees in Thailand.
